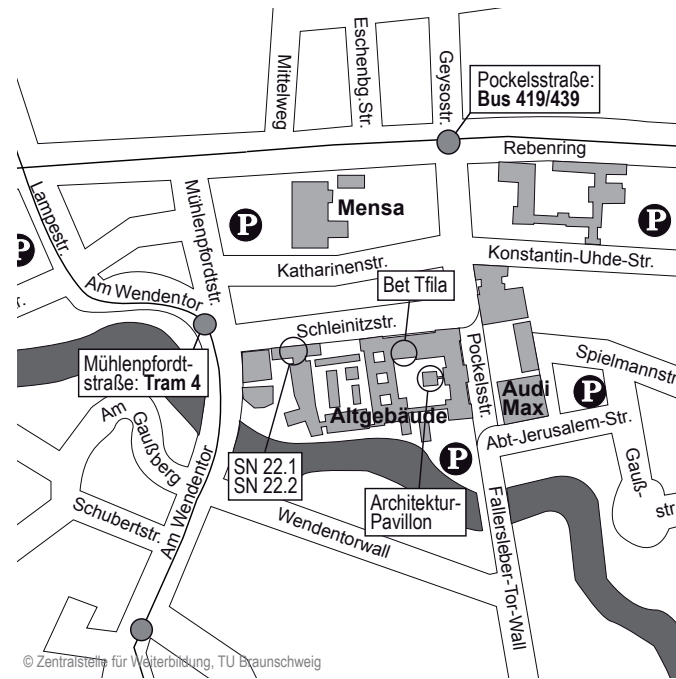

“Jewish Architecture in Europe“ International Congress

The architectural heritage of Jewish culture in Europe is a multi-disciplined and wide field of research. The international and interdisciplinary congress “Jewish Architecture in Europe” aims to give an overview on the actual state of research.

Of particular interest is the architecture of synagogues. The congress is organized by the Bet Tfila – Research Unit for Jewish Architecture in Europe at the Technische Universität Braunschweig and the Center for Jewish Art at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem.

Lecturers from Europe, the USA and Israel will report and discuss results of their research and plans for the exploration of Jewish buildings in Europe. Special focus will be placed on the architectural history of synagogues. Its development throughout the ages can be traced back from ancient times to the present, which reflect different paths, leading to a wide variety of synagogue buildings in different regions of Europe. National Socialism and WWII destroyed vast parts of the architectural legacy of Jewish culture in Europe and even nowadays Jewish buildings are endangered.

We are very grateful to Stiftung Braunschweigischer Kulturbesitz for generously supporting the congress, to the Technische Universität Braunschweig and the Braunschweigisches Landesmuseum for providing the infrastructure for this conference.

The lectures will be published in a volume as part of a series of publications by the Bet Tfila - Research Unit for Jewish Architecture in Europe.

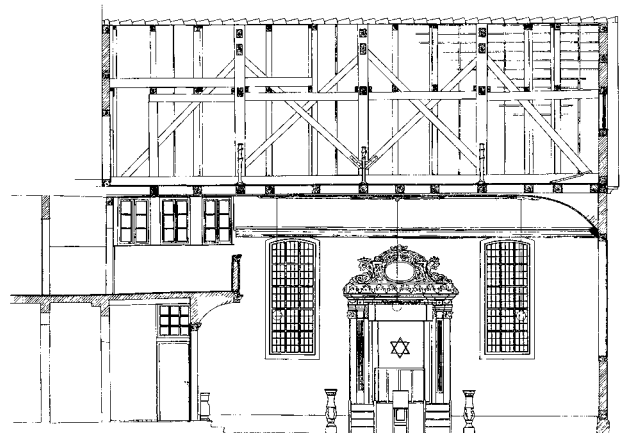
Information for Registration
